International students

Tauranga Girls' College is a signatory to, and has agreed to observe and be bound by, the Education (Pastoral Care of Tertiary and International Learners) Code of Practice 2021, published by the Ministry of Education. Application procedures

Application forms are available on our website tgc.school.nz/international. Please use the 'Enquire or Apply now' button. This takes you directly to our online enrolment process.

Medical and travel insurance

The Code of Practice and Immigration New Zealand, require all international students studying in New Zealand to have full travel and medical insurance while in New Zealand. The insurance policy must be compliant with the New Zealand Qualification Authority and if written in another language, must be supplied with an English translation.

Immigration requirements

Details for student visa and NZeTA visas including any advice about work rights and employment are found on Immigration New Zealand's website immigration.govt.nz.

Grievance procedure

The Director of International Students is the contact person for students who have a grievance or complaint. The International Department provides a flow chart detailing procedures for complaints. International students not satisfied with the outcome of the school's formal complaint process may raise their concerns with NZQA by submitting a complaint query on their website, through email or by phone.
