## **COVID-19 (CORONA VIRUS)**

Be assured, we continue to be advised by the Ministry of Education and Ministry of Health regarding this virus. As communicated previously, we do not have any domestic or international students (or staff) who require to be 'self isolated' and nor do we have international students who have been travelling on the British ship the Diamond Princess. It is important to keep this virus in perspective (annually approx 500,000 people die from the common flu) and the media loop about the event is not helpful. The Human Rights Commission is urging Kiwis not to let "fears turn into ignorance, rudeness or racism" amid the coronavirus scare and I would appreciate your part in remembering this.

# ACORN FOUNDATION WALTERS FAMILY OVERSEAS TRAVEL AWARD

Tauranga Girls' College and the Acorn Foundation invite applications from students to apply for an Overseas Travel Award, from a fund of up to \$2,000.

The intention of this award is to provide a financial contribution to a worthy student(s) to pursue international travel as part of their personal growth and to enrich their life experiences.

Once I had finished the final sketches and decided on what I was going to be doing, I began the paper mache process, scrunching up newspaper into a rough shape and gluing paper towels over it to create more detail. Once that was done, I then used glue soaked toilet paper to make everything smoother, and make finer details such as the eyes and nostrils. I made the ears using card I had curled into a cone like shape, and used the same process of gluing paper over it. After that was complete, I added some colour here and there and a crown of flowers to top it all off. After all of this, my sculpture was finished.

## **COURSE AIM**

To provide students with a foundation level of understanding of the knowledge, skills, attributes and attitudes associated with the Police and Policing in Aotearoa New Zealand. At the completion of this course, students will be endorsed with the distance learning course within the recruitment process.

## **COURSE OBJECTIVES FOR POLICE STUDIES**

- Understand the roles and responsibilities of a Constable of New Zealand Police
- Understand the different career opportunities within New Zealand Police
- Demonstrate knowledge of initial scene investigation
- · Apply appropriate law and legislation to various policing tasks in the community
- Understand and demonstrate the six core values of New Zealand Police: PRIMED
- Understand basic investigative interview skills, and apply these to situations which are common as a Constable of New Zealand Police
- Understand knowledge of New Zealand Court procedures and processes
- Demonstrate the physical attributes required for a Recruit of New Zealand Police
- Explore the leadership requirements of a police officer
