We encourage whānau to continue connecting with subject and whānau teachers, should you require any extra information or support around your daughter's learning.






ARTS COMPETITION

The first material I used to create my painting was white crayon, I drew small designs onto the piece of paper. Then I painted dye onto the paper, I didn't place the dve too close to the edge of the paper. The white crayon showed through the dye by pushing it away. Then I used a glaze medium mixed with paint, which I scraped on top of the dye and crayon.

I sponged paint through stencils and I placed them all over the painting. To finish it off, I used paint pens and drew patterns and traced some of the stencils, I also used a normal black pen to add smaller designs.

Almost 50 Tauranga Girls' College students are registered with the Blue Light Youth Driver Navigator Programme this year.



The Blue Light Youth Driver Navigator programme is designed to help support young people to ultimately get their full drivers licence. It is especially designed for those young people who may not have access to the right support to be able to learn to drive, e.g. a vehicle or someone to teach them to drive. The Programme Coordinator will manage the learner drivers through the three components of the driver licensing system of Learners, Restricted and Full Licences. Each learner driver is matched with a volunteer driver navigator who is trained and supported by the Programme Coordinator and a professional driving instructor. The driver navigators supervise the learner drivers practice driving in a vehicle provided by the programme. Licencing and course costs are met by the programme where the student does not have the means to do so.

New Zealand Blue Light are seeking volunteers. Please share with whānau or anyone else you know who may be able to offer to become a Driver Navigator. It is a very rewarding role.
